It's has been a while since our last Newsletter and we hope to get back in the swing of our previous community efforts. Our FRNA Board again met on March 13th and will re-energize a number of our previous efforts in our Fox Run Community. Ongoing efforts to get a traffic signal at Fox Knoll and Nacogdoches, Stop Signs and "Calming Devices" (Speed Bumps) leading back to Fox Run Elementary, and water abatement problems along Fox Creek and Fox Head will resume our priorities with District 10 and the CoSA. (We do have new information regarding our efforts and city responses later in this Newsletter)

She will continue to serve the Fox Run Community as a representative to the SA Tomorrow Rolling Oaks Area Region Center Plan (See the are developments later in this Newsletter). 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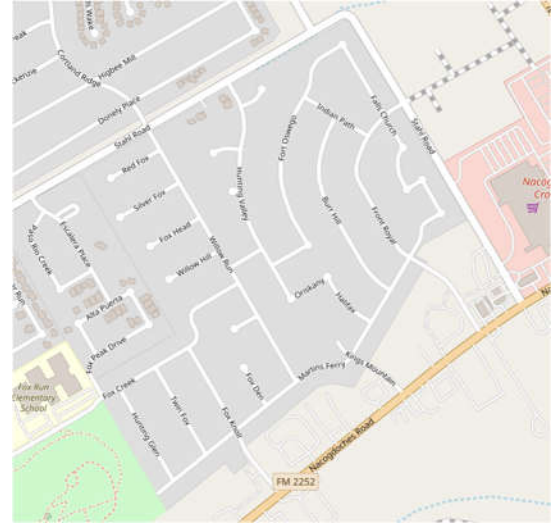

Developments and Future Improvements in our Community

First of all, we wish to announce the successful lobby efforts to secure funding from the City of Antonio for two projects: the Fox Creek Drainage Improvement Project and the Fox Head Drainage Improvement Project, both fund by the city for fiscal year 2022. We thank Rusty Koehler of leading the efforts for the Fox Head Community and to Jeanmarie Traversi for her efforts in organizing all the neighbors along in documenting and challenging the developers in drainage issues impacting our Fox Run residents. We will monitor the developments of these projects, schedule to begin in the Summer of 2024. Thanks to Rusty and Jeanmarie for all their efforts.



The SA Tomorrow Rolling Oaks Area Regional Center Plan is an area-wide planning project by the City of San Antonio (COSA) to involve area resident in the future perspective of our are development. Our President, Ken Weber and Kathy Short (FRNA representative) will officially serve on this planning commission as the Fox Run representatives. Any input by Fox Run Community members is welcomed.

Speaking of developments, you have all seen the development of the Nacogdoches Crossing (current Apartment development adjacent Walmart) and a proposed development Alta Nacogdoches Development of approximately 250 apartments to be constructed between the Nacogdoches Crossing development and the railroad tracks at Green Mountain. Our major concern with the Nacogdoches Crossing development is 1) the capacity of the 350 units is now set to approximately 650 units and 2) the “secondary” access to this complex is on Stahl Road, directly across from the Front Royal entry into Fox Run. Our concerns (as voiced to the city) is the congestion along Stahl Road and traffic through Fox Run using Front Royal. With the development of Alta Nacogdoches, we are concerned of the possible congestion at Green Mountain and Stahl and have proposed to the city to a configuration change to move the intersection of Stahl and Green Mountain to a “T” intersection, taking out that dangerous curse at Stahl. The developers have already committed to providing their land to the city for this projects and also have proposed a hiking path around their developments to be available to Fox Run residents. We view this as positive developments to our community.

Finally, the property at 15709 Nacogdoches is being considered for Re-Zoning to C-2 CD (Conditional District). The back 1/3 of this property is currently zoned a R-6 (residential). It appears that all the properties along Nacogdoches that are adjacent to the Martins Ferry properties, were changed to R-6 in 2003 due to a re-platting of properties located at Fox Knoll and Martins Ferry. The FRNA Board supports this development of small business warehousing operations.
